2035 General Plan Information

The General Plan is required by the State of California to guide city growth, land use, infrastructure, and planning for city services. Stockton's planning area boundaries generally extend to:

- · Armstrong Road and Live Oak Road on the north,
- Jack Tone Road on the east,
- Roth Road on the south, and
- San Joaquin River, Burns Cutoff, Stockton Deep Water Channel, Fourteen Mile Slough, and Bishop Cut on the west

The 2035 General Plan approved by City Council on December 11, 2007, provides guiding policy for all growth and development within the City. The City's General Plan addresses new and existing areas as a series of distinctive neighborhoods and villages and to guide growth and revitalize districts and corridors.

The General Plan consists of 11 elements that address both state-mandated planning issues plus optional subjects of particular concern with Stockton.

- Economic Development
- Health and Safety
- Housing Element
- Land Use
- Natural and Cultural Resources
- Public Facilities and Services
- Recreation and Waterways
- Transportation and Circulation
- Youth and Education
