I, Janet D. Bricker, declare: I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration and, if called as a witness, I could and would testify competently to these facts under oath. 2. I was born on June 29, 1945 and am 66 years old. I live at 184 Rivergate Place, Lodi, California. 3. I was hired by the City of Stockton in January of 1990 and retired in November of 2008 as an Executive Assistant. My spouse is my dependent on the City's Health Plan. We both have enough 4. quarters to qualify for Medicare. My CALPERS retirement check is \$2,301.22. My net annual income is \$37,491. 5. 6. I am informed and believe the City has adopted a monthly premium for retiree health benefits. If required to pay this premium to receive City Health Plan benefits, even with a \$150 subsidy that has been offered by the City for one year, my premium would be \$621.53 monthly, and \$7,458.36 annually. This would represent 20% of my income. //

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7. My spouse and I are both under frequent doctors' care due to high blood pressure and sugar diabetes which require prescriptions on a regular basis. It is not clear whether or not having these pre-existing conditions would prevent us from obtaining other medical coverage that would be affordable or prevent us from getting any coverage at all. I have already paid \$725.88 for prescriptions this year above the amount the City has paid, and the year is not half over. At this time we are not able to qualify for Medicare prescription because they only have enrollment in the fall.
