DISTRICT 2 APPLICANT – RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS

QUESTION #1

The City of Stockton's three highest priority challenges are:

- 1) to be fiscally prudent post-bankruptcy
- 2) reduce crime
- 3) encourage more jobs within the City

I will work cooperatively with fellow council members and staff to implement the post-bankruptcy Plan of Adjustment and put the City on a solid and secure financial footing. I have considerable experience in operating a Department within a fixed budget and meeting priorities within that budget. That skill will assist me in making sure the City will live within its budget and avoid future financial crises.

To reduce crime, the City must maintain and strengthen its current multi-pronged approach to stop the main perpetrators of crime and to ensure there are consequences to criminal behavior. The residents, businesses and the whole community must be engaged to help reduce crime and to provide positive alternatives to joining gangs and engaging in criminal behavior. If I am appointed as city council member, I will work hard to provide a solid post-bankruptcy budget which will establish a clear and secure work environment for police officers' salary and benefits. The City's poor financial situation creates an unstable environment that inhibits recruitment and retention of police officers. The City's financial health must improve.

Jobs and the income they provide are key to the wellbeing of our residents and the City as a whole. Much of my career has been engaged in helping businesses' succeed and removing governmental barriers and obstacles. As a council member I can help to retain our existing businesses and help them to expand and add more workers. I have a solid, successful record in attracting businesses and jobs to a community, experience that I will use to help increase jobs in Stockton. Stockton is a regional hub; we should also be the hub of job growth and business success. Many individuals have stated that the City should eliminate unnecessary and burdensome regulations and requirements to promote growth. I know how to implement those efforts. Much of my career in planning involved simplifying city zoning regulations and related codes and rules. Making the process for opening and operating a business easier can do much to improve the City's business climate. I have the experience and collaborative skills and desire to build the City's business potential.

As a council member I can help the City Council to provide the direction and leadership to implement these three priority challenges.

QUESTION #2

I am willing to make the tough decisions, as necessary, to maintain a balanced budget and to keep the City on track to being fiscally strong. I apply fiscal discipline in my personal life and I applied it in my 35 year career in public service, managing government budgets.

In Question #1, I discussed briefly the importance of the City's post-bankruptcy financial stability. I am committed to keeping the City on track financially to maintain its ability to provide all the services that a City must provide. I will carefully ensure that the City's service commitments are balanced by City revenue. All budget expenditures must be paid for by continuing revenue sources. I will also work to ensure the City maintains an adequate reserve for unforeseen expenses and I commit to identifying new revenue sources for any request to increase services or expenditures by the City. This includes expenditure increases due to inflation and increases in salaries of the City's workforce.

QUESTION #3

The Marshall Plan is a multi-pronged approach to reducing crime and merits strong support. The partnership of County, State and Federal law enforcement agencies with the City's Police Department to focus on specific criminal hotspots and stopping criminal leaders should be continued. Increasing the City's police force through better recruitment and retention efforts, as mentioned in the previous questions, will help ensure that the City will have the manpower to more fully implement the Marshall Plan. Involving community members, businesses, clergy and non-profit organizations in this effort is also critical. As a religious leader and as a community member that is active in non-profit activities, I am intimately aware of how critical it is to have programs to help our youth and young adults. Programs need to be in place to help encourage and direct them to productive and rewarding activities instead of a life of violence, crime and heartache. These efforts help to prevent crime and provide positive alternatives. Policies cannot stop crime alone; it takes the whole community to reduce crime. A council member can be a positive catalyst to engaging the community in these efforts.

QUESTION #4

As a council member, I commit to working with the other city council members and staff to make policy decisions that will benefit the City. I also commit to communicating the reasons behind these policy decisions to the residents of Stockton. In my 35 years working in local government, I have developed skills at communicating complex policies or decisions to residents and to businesses so that all understand how decisions are made. I will evaluate staff recommendations on their merits. My decisions will be based on what is best for the City of Stockton and its residents and will not be based on perceptions or politics. I am thorough in my analysis of reports, and I do my homework. I am diligent and responsible in my deliberations. I also work collaboratively with fellow decision makers and the community. Once a decision is made by the full city council, I will fully support it even if I may be a minority voice in the deliberations about that decision. I bring strong analytical and communication skills to the City Council that can be used to help the City reach its fiscal and operational goals.

QUESTION #5

The Mayor has an institutional role as the City Council's leader and figurehead. The Mayor conducts meetings, influences the agendas and makes appointments to various city commissions and boards, which are subject to the City Council ratification. Both the Mayor and Council members are responsible to fully discuss and explore ideas and recommendations and ensure the City operates within a sound budget. Both the Mayor and Council Members establish City policy and provide direction to staff. Both the Mayor and council members meet with the public to respond to needs, hear problems and complaints, and ensure the City's processes are open and transparent.

QUESTIONS #6

My greatest "goals to accomplish" should I be appointed as council member are to be open and transparent and have the public feel welcome and comfortable to discuss issues and ideas with me at council and committee meetings and at other settings. I want to help the public feel connected to their City and feel part of it, understanding both the benefits and responsibilities of city citizenship. Making meaningful improvements to the residents' quality of life is my greatest goal. Working on the three highest priority challenges I identified in Question #1 is a big part of this effort to make my hometown better. It seems that in recent years many of my fellow residents have expressed their feeling that they are disconnected from the decisions and actions of the City. I believe that better communication between the City Council and the community about these decisions can improve general understanding and improve trust. I am committed to making efforts to bridge that gap in communication. The City has worked hard to achieve positive results and outcomes for the City, but it is equally important to have an open and inclusive process to achieve those outcomes. If I have an opportunity to serve as a city council member, my ultimate goal is to have the City of Stockton become a better place for all to live in, and a City that all citizens can be proud of.
