

California Recycles

California's Waste Management Act of 1989 requires all counties and cities in the state to divert 50% of its waste materials from landfills (AB 939). Construction and demolition debris accounts for about 20-30% of our waste stream. Recycling construction and demolition materials is therefore essential for the city to meet its recycling requirements.

Common construction and demolition materials include lumber, concrete, asphalt, drywall, metals, bricks, carpet, rocks, dirt, cardboard, and various roofing materials. Many of these materials can be reused or recycled, which can save money while protecting many of our natural resources.

Construction & Demolition Debris Recycling Program



What is the Construction and Demolition Debris Waste Reduction Program?

The City of Stockton requires that all construction, demolition, or renovation project permit applicants are required to reuse, recycle, or divert 50% or more of the construction and demolition debris generated at project sites.

How Do I comply?

Complete a Recycling Plan

- The plan should include the anticipated materials to be generated and hauling plan
- Identify the waste that your project will generate
- No permit number will be issued until a Recycling Plan is submitted

Outline a Hauling Method

- Self-Haul
- Hire a permitted waste hauler

Maintain and Return a Recycling Report

Return your recycling report within 14 days of job completion.

Failure to submit your completed report in a timely manner may result in fines and/or citations.

Who Can I Hire to Haul Waste?

Only permitted haulers can collect and haul construction and demolition debris from job sites in the City of Stockton.

What are the Basics?

The City of Stockton's C&D Debris Recycling Program is as easy as 1-2-3.

- 1 Submit Your Recycling Plan**
Required to be submitted with your permit application
- 2 Execute Your Recycling Plan**
Use the Resource List. Remember to identify yourself as a City of Stockton C&D customer
- 3 Report Your Results**
e-mail the Recycling Report with all receipts and weight tickets no later than 14 days after completing the project to:
