Alexandria Place Culvert Replacement Project Culvert Replacement at Alexandria Place and Five Mile Slough Begins May 31

STOCKTON, Calif. – The City of Stockton is working to replace the pipe, or culvert, within Five Mile Slough that passes water under the roadway at Alexandria Place. The Alexandria Culvert Replacement Project will begin on Tuesday, May 31, 2022, and has an anticipated completion date of October 1, 2022. The existing culvert, which is corrugated metal, has failed and will be replaced with a concrete box culvert. The project will also include the installation of erosion control measures at the Five Mile Slough stormwater pump station.

During construction, Alexandria Place will be closed near the construction site at Five Mile Slough, which is near Lincoln Road.

- Vehicles traveling southbound on Alexandria Place (from north of Lincoln Road) will detour at Meadow Avenue.
- Vehicles traveling northbound on Alexandria Place (from south of Lincoln Road) will detour by turning right onto Lincoln Road.

Common destinations in the area that will be impacted during peak traffic hours include Lincoln High School, Sierra Middle School, Swenson Golf Course, and Swenson Park. This route is also typically used for destinations on both Hammer Lane and Benjamin Holt Drive.

Pershing Avenue is currently closed to southbound traffic at Hammer Lane for a San Joaquin County construction project. The intersection of Pershing and Meadow will be open, allowing southbound traffic on Pershing from Meadow by May 31, 2022.

When traveling in the project area, please reduce speed and drive carefully. Watch for pedestrians and plan extra time and routes to destinations, accordingly. Please use major streets, such as Benjamin Holt Drive, Hammer Lane, and Pacific Avenue to avoid detours.
